Nurse's Notes—Pink Eye

Conjunctivitis, commonly known as pink eye, is an inflammation of the conjunctiva, the clear membrane that covers the white part of the eye and the inner surface of the eyelids. While pink eye can sometimes be alarming because it makes the eyes extremely red and spreads rapidly, it's a fairly common condition and usually cause no long term eye or vision damage. But if your child shows symptoms of pink eye it is important to see a doctor. Some types of pink eye require treatment. Treatment options may vary depending upon the cause of the infection.
